Discussion:

As you are aware, the Joint Land Use Study (JLUS) Policy Committee Accepted the final JLUS on August 19th. The contents of the entire report and all of the appendices can be found here: <http://www.lemoorejlus.com/documents.html>. The next steps for each of the participating agencies is to review the recommendations applicable, then determine whether or not we can endorse some or all of the recommendations. Attached please find the JLUS Executive Summary and Section 3, City of Lemoore, which includes 21 specific recommendations for the City of Lemoore beginning on Page 3-30.

Throughout the JLUS process, a great deal of public comments were submitted. I previously emailed to the Council copies of letters recently received, as well as a detailed matrix of comments previously received. The City Council should carefully consider those matters, along with the JLUS compatibility with the 2030 General Plan as you review the recommendations.

On Tuesday afternoon, I suggest the Council review each of the 21 recommendations for the City of Lemoore and determine if there is consensus to pursue each. Many are quite compatible with the 2030 General Plan, and are able to be implemented without trouble. At the September 20, 2011 Council Meeting, assuming no further discussion is needed, I propose the Council consider approving a Resolution that clearly states which of the recommendations the City supports and can commit to work towards implementing.

Please recall that back in April, the Council reviewed a draft of the JLUS document, and after review, authorized the April 5, 2011 letter (attached) to be filed with the Policy Committee as the Council's official comments.
