Indoor soccer starts this week and there are 560 children enrolled. Adult men's and coed soccer starts this week as well. There is an over 35 men's soccer league pending as have three teams and looking for a fourth.

Parks and Recreation Director Glick stated the Parks and Recreation overall revenue projections are up and participation is up.

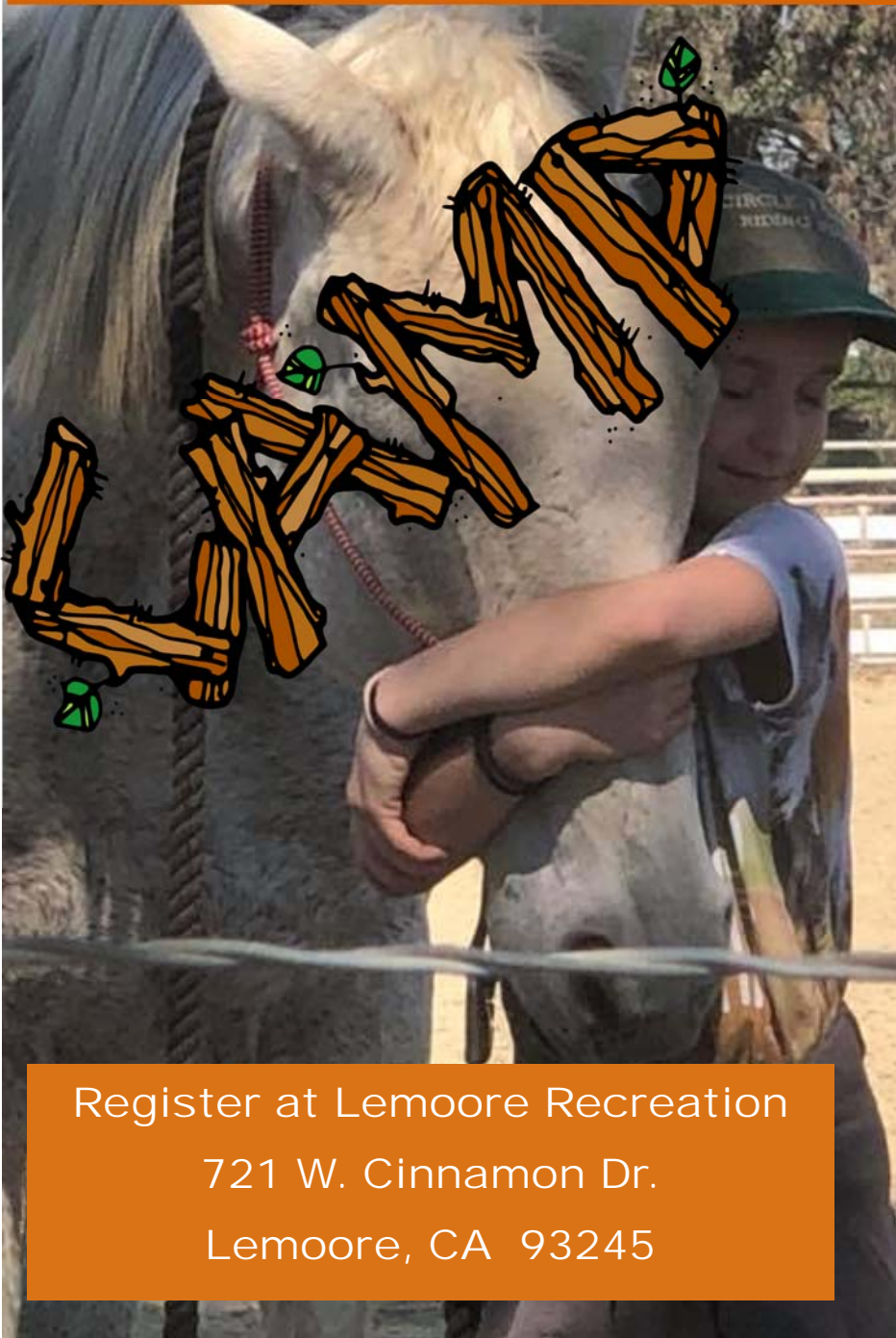

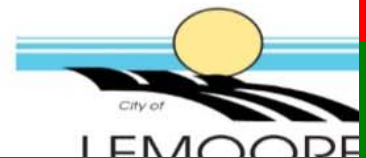

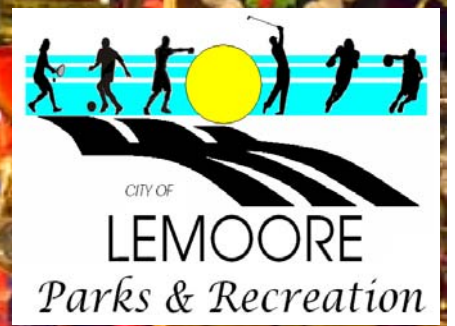
