



MOTOR UNIT & TRAFFIC

TRAFFIC safety continues to be an area of public concern. Our department is sensitive to this issue and sets a high priority on responding to concerns and inquiries generated by the public.

The Speed Display Boards continue to be an important tool for promoting traffic safety awareness. Dedicated school patrol is used during the school season, including enforcement and fixed traffic control during peak times at West Hills College.

The Lemoore Police Department issued **1,089** traffic citations in 2021.

The Lemoore Police Department Traffic Unit is made up of two officers and overseen by a sergeant. The unit is Officer Steven McPherson and a vacant position at this time. Traffic enforcement officers receive extensive training in Traffic Accident Investigation, taxi cab inspections, child car seat installation and inspection, radar usage, conducting speed surveys, and motorcycle operation.

Lemoore officers made **89 drunk driving** arrests in 2021 as compared to 92 drunk driving arrests made in 2020.

There were **95 traffic accidents** reported in 2021 as compared to 99 in 2020, an approximate **4%** decrease in accidents.




2021 RESPONSE TIME






DETECTIVES

The Detectives Unit was assigned approximately 260 cases for investigation or follow up in 2021. The Detective Division consists of Sgt. John Henderson, Detective Cpl. Osvaldo Maldonado, Detective Ryan O'Barr, Lemoore High School Youth Development Officer Justin Perkins, Liberty Middle School Officer Katarina Escobar, School Resource Officer Kody Rogers, and School Resource Officer Jason Stephens. The team had approximately 55 arrests for 2021. The clearance rate for cases was 98 percent.

In 2021, there were a number of major crimes which required extensive investigation and consumed a significant amount of time from the investigations division. Detective investigations entailed interviews, identifying witnesses, suspect interrogations, search warrants, arrest warrants, forensic interviews (MDICS), evidence preservation/ collection, surveillance, and undercover operations. The purpose of the detective division is to investigate serious crimes that need investigative expertise and require a large amount of time. Detectives attend extensive additional training and schools such as Core Investigation, Search Warrant School, Homicide School, Sexual Assault School, Interview and Interrogation School, Child Endangerment/Abuse School, Officer Involved Shooting School, and Sex Offender/Registrant School. Most Detective courses are put on by the Institute of Criminal Investigations known as ICI. The majority of detective cases include rapes, lewd acts against children, shootings, stabbings, robberies, burglaries/thefts, stolen vehicles, homicides and attempted homicides, suspicious deaths, fraud, assaults w/ great bodily injuries, assault with deadly weapons, embezzlements, and stolen property reports. The following are just a few examples of the investigations that the Detectives and Youth Development Officers solved:

Through out the year, the team investigated numerous child porn cases with the assistance of the ICAC task force (Internet Crimes Against Children) resulting in the arrest of suspects in possession of child porn.

On April 22, 2021, the team responded to the scene of a drive by shooting in the 100 block of Magnolia Ave. where a victim had been shot and wounded. The team identified a suspect and he was placed under arrest.

On July 10, 2021, Detectives responded to the 700 block of S. Lemoore Ave. for a report of the occupants of one vehicle shooting at another, which resulted in a homicide. The team began the investigation with no leads. This investigation was solved with the suspect arrested within 24 hours.

On October 25, 2021, Detectives investigated a domestic violence related homicide in the 600 block of E. Deodar Ln. This suspect was located and placed under arrest.

EVIDENCE & PROPERTY

The Lemoore Police Department has one full time Evidence Technician, **Elizabeth Halstead**.



Evidence Technician Halstead is responsible for receiving and storing all evidence seized by members of the department. She also handles found property turned in by citizens. Some additional responsibilities include federal firearm traces, major crime scene processing, evidence collection, and the proper disposal of evidence and found property items.

In 2021, our Evidence Technician processed over six thousand items of evidence. This evidence ranged from recovered firearms to narcotics turned in by Officers. Evidence Technician Halstead assisted LPD Detectives and patrol by processing crime scenes and numerous vehicles involved in major crimes. She also collected numerous sexual assault evidence kits and sent them off to the lab for DNA processing.

Evidence Technician Halstead assisted patrol by responding to burglary scenes where latent prints were recovered and collected items that needed to be fumed for latent prints or processed for DNA. She worked closely with the Kings County District Attorney's Office by ensuring that all evidential items were made available for discovery for legal proceedings. She received a total of 16,761 Body Worn Videos that needed to be retained or disposed of accordingly.


RANGE

The Department has 5 total Range masters. Range staff also consists of certified Armorers.

In 2021, the Lemoore Police Department detectives transitioned from 9mm Glock 17 pistol to a G43X Glock pistol. The 9mm are generally the most reliable pistols available and the cost 9mm ammunition is significantly less expensive and can save law enforcement agencies thousands of dollars.

This year the range staff provided a combined total of over 100 hours of firearms training to LPD officers, to include annual qualifications. The firearms training consists of tactical responses, positional shooting, rifle deployment/transition, shooting while moving, shooting from cover, dominant and support hand shooting, and magazine reloads.







The Lemoore Police Department is very fortunate to have employee's that have been specifically trained or have specific knowledge in areas beneficial to law enforcement. Each of these trainers/instructors is passionate about their specialized knowledge or ability and is enthusiastic to teach other persons in the Department.

At this time the Lemoore Police Department has 5 POST certified Arrest & Control Instructors and 4 POST certified Impact Weapons Instructors.

Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) does not mandate training for law enforcement in arrest and control or impact weapons to maintain proficiency as it does with firearms training. Considering that each arrest involves some type of physical interaction with the person being arrested, officers need to be well versed in handcuffing, joint lock manipulation, pugilistic skills and ground submissions. POST does mandate officers attend a 24-hour Perishable Skills training every two years. Four of those hours are designated to the area of arrest and control.

Each arrest has the potential to be turn violent requiring officers to rely on their training and experience. Not all arrests end in the usage of a firearm, but do end in the officer controlling the subject with their hands.

The Lemoore Police Department currently conducts 8 hours of training as part of the orientation of new hired officers. The new hired officers spend 8 hours with the arrest and control instructors and the 8 hours is broken up into two segments. The first four hours of arrest and control consist of; joint lock manipulation, pugilistics and ground fighting. The second segment is 4 hours of impact weapons; straight baton, side handle baton and expandable baton.

In the upcoming years, we plan to incorporate arrest and control with simunitions training. Scenarios will be created that require officers to transition use of force options.

Consider these statistics for the Lemoore Police Department:



CENTRAL VALLEY REGIONAL SWAT

In 2021, The Central Valley Regional SWAT team responded to a total of 11 SWAT call outs. Three of those call outs were in Lemoore, Four in Hanford, Three in Corcoran, and 1 in Kettleman City.

The Central Valley Regional SWAT team is composed of designated police officers from different agencies. These officers are chosen. trained, and equipped to work as a coordinated team and respond to critical incidents. Hanford, Lemoore, Corcoran all provide officers to the team so that if the need arises in the region the team can respond and handle the situation by focusing in the protection of life and property.

The Lemoore Police Department currently has three police officers assigned to the Central Valley Regional SWAT team. These officers train with the SWAT team 6 hours every other week. Training includes and is not limited to handling barricaded subjects, hostage rescue, and high risk search warrants.

In 2021, the Lemoore Police Department sent one officer to the Basic SWAT academy so that he could be certified and participate in the team. The training consisted of 80 hours of P.O.S.T. certified training. The Central Valley Regional SWAT team held approximately 22 training sessions in 2021. The three Lemoore officers assigned to the team received over 300 hours of training.

One of the greatest benefits of having SWAT officers in the department is that these officers share the training with the rest of the officers. Some of the training that is shared entails individual movement techniques, weapon manipulation, team communication, tactical decision making, and leadership skills.

CENTRAL VALLEY REGIONAL **CRISIS NEGOTIATION TEAM**

The Central Valley Regional Crisis Negotiation Team (CNT) provides skilled verbal communicators who are utilized in an effort to de-escalate and effect safe surrender in critical

situations where individuals have taken hostages, barricaded themselves, or have suicidal ideations. The team consists of law enforcement officers from the Hanford, Lemoore, and Corcoran Police Departments. CNT complements the SWAT team during high risk operations and is also used as a resource during other critical situations. CNT employs crisis intervention tactics, including de-escalation efforts, to peacefully resolve dangerous events.

CNT members train on a monthly basis and attend annual conferences to maintain their skillset and ensure that every effort is made to preserve life and safely resolve each situation.

In 2021, the Central Valley Crisis Negotiation Team responded in conjunction with the Central Valley Regional SWAT Team to 11 Callouts. Three in the City of Lemoore, four in the City of Hanford, three in the City of Corcoran, and one in Kettleman City.



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT OFFICERS & CAMPUS POLICE OFFICER

The Lemoore Police Department has one Youth Development Officer assigned to Lemoore High School, one YDO assigned to Liberty Middle School and Lemoore Elementary School District, and one School Resource Officer assigned to West Hills College. The School Officers are the liaisons between the elementary schools, middle schools, high school, and community college, with the Police Department.


Youth Development Officer Justin Perkins was assigned to Lemoore High School as the YDO for 2021. The Youth Development Officer was involved in 761 incidents. He conducted 97 investigations.

Youth Development Officer Katarina Escobar was assigned to the Lemoore Elementary School District and Liberty Middle School. The LUESD officer was involved in 675 incidents. The Youth Development Officer investigated 94 cases.









The school officers also assisted the schools by ensuring the safety of the students and the public during special events such as graduations, sporting events, parades, and other events that required a team effort between the school staff and the police department.



K-9 UNIT

The Lemoore Police Department began its canine unit in 2006 and has continued to maintain the highest standards for a canine unit since its inception. The canine unit serves many purposes and has many capabilities. These capabilities include searching for lost or missing children, searching for and apprehending wanted violent criminals, sniffing out illegal narcotics, searching for evidence or other articles in large open areas, and serving as a first line of defense when an officer or the K-9 handler is violently attacked.

The canine unit is made up of two teams. Officer Jacques and his K9 partner Diesel and Officer Trevino and his K9 partner Rocket.

In October of 2021, K-9 Diesel and Rocket successfully completed their yearly recertification for patrol and narcotic related functions. Due to the pandemic, the K-9 unit was unable to participate in demonstrations at various events throughout the year to include the MIQ Fall Festival, Relay for life, and Red Ribbon Week.

K-9 Diesel and Rocket recovered more than 50 grams of methamphetamine, 12 grams of heroin, 4 grams of cocaine and 4 firearms. They also had more than 20 arrests and surrenders.

The canine unit, on a daily basis, serves as a deterrent to criminal activities, officer assaults, as well as fleeing arrest by their mere presence at the scenes of criminal activities which cannot be defined in numbers for statistical purposes. The Lemoore Police Department Canine Unit has met the challenge and has proven to be an asset to our community, officers, and fellow law enforcement agencies.

During 2021, the K-9 unit logged over 400 hours of training and had a total of 88 K9 utilizations.



CODE ENFORCEMENT

Community Service Officers respond to public nuisance complaints such as yard maintenance, abandoned vehicles, illegal dumping, weed abatement, property maintenance, and animal control related issues. They educate the public and enforce municipal codes regarding these violations. Their primary goal is to gain voluntary compliance from the public or businesses. CSO's also manage crime prevention programs such as Crime Free Multi Housing and Neighborhood Watch programs. Furthermore, CSO's play a major role in organizing Community Oriented Policing events such as Red Ribbon Week and National Night Out. In 2021, the Lemoore Police Department had one full time and one part time Community Service Officer. The CSO's handled 1,360 calls for service.



The Lemoore Police Department has one full time Animal Control Officer (ACO). His duties are fulfilled by one of the two community service officers when he is not available. Some of the calls for service that he handles are the following: Animal abuse, animal neglect, municipal code violations, barking dogs, loose animals, and sick/injured/dead animals.

The Animal Control Officer is cross-trained in code enforcement and will fill that role when necessary. The ACO also manages the Citizen's Academy, helps with the Volunteers in Policing Program and other community oriented policing programs.



PROBLEM ORIENTED POLICING (POP)

On May 1, 2015, the Lemoore Police Department formed the Problem Orientated Policing (POP) team to further the mission and address the needs of the community. The team's goals were to establish additional partnerships within the community and, through a proven four step

method, reduce and eliminate public nuisances and address violations of the law and public disorder that can deteriorate the community and reduce the quality of life for our citizens. In 2021, our POP Officer was Officer Cleby Santos.

Due to the Corona Virus, the POP team was unable to host a Coffee with a Cop event and other community events which would have taken place at different businesses in the City of Lemoore.

The POP team conducted city wide probation and parole compliance checks with the assistance of the Kings County Probation Department, KCMCTF and the Hanford Parole Office, among other county agencies. These compliance checks yielded arrests for subjects being under the influence of a narcotic, possession of drug paraphernalia and warrant violations. They also assisted the Hanford Police Department in similar compliance checks and worked closely with the Lemoore Police Departments Detective Division.

The POP team assisted the detective division and was involved in several investigations throughout the year. Some of those cases involved a homicide and shootings throughout the city.

The POP team was very involved with the homeless in the city. Officer Santos would contact the subjects weekly and attempt to get them living assistance and any other services available.

During the 2021 year, Officer Santos was a total of 620 incidents. He took 41 new cases and wrote 55 supplemental reports.

The Lemoore Chaplains Program was established in 1996 to provide aid and comfort to those in need and to provide a calm and thoughtful presence in times of stress, hardship, and grief. These volunteers provide 24/7 chaplaincy services to officers, civilian employees, and family members of the Lemoore Police Department.

CHAPLAINS

Our Chaplains continue to offer the following services:

- Responded to unattended deaths
- · Delivered death notification
- Responded to house and apartment fires
- Helped with coordinating Red Cross services
- Visited sick and injured officers and their family members
- · Counseled and made referrals
- Helped with end-of-life care and decisions
- Helped arrange assistance for those terminally ill
- Supported the survivors of officers killed in the line of duty
- Officiated over police wakes and funerals
- · Hosted official functions, e.g. the Annual Volunteers Banquet
- · Given the invocation at various official events

Chaplains also assist officers in dealing with the incredible stress that comes from taking a life in the line of duty. The Chaplains are very proactive - meeting with the officers at roll calls, as well as being present on the street with the officers in their daily realm.



The Lemoore Police Reserve Unit was established to supplement and assist full time sworn police officers in their duties. The unit provides professional sworn reserve police officers who can augment full time police officers to meet and maintain staffing levels. The Reserve Program can also be a stepping stone into a full time police officer position. Reserve officers assist full time officers in the enforcement of laws and maintaining peace and order within the community making them a valuable asset to our community.

Reserve police officers are required to work a minimum of 16 hours per month and are generally assigned to the Operation Division to supplement patrol in various aspects of their day to day operation. Reserve officers may also be assigned to assist in the property room with evidence maintenance, assist in the investigation of major traffic collisions or major crime trends as well. The Reserve Unit is supervised by a Lemoore Police Department Sergeant who serves as the Reserve Coordinator. During 2021 Lemoore Police Department had 9 Level I Reserve Police Officers.

In 2021, Lemoore Reserve Police Officers:

- Worked over 5937 hours
- Responded to 4864 calls for service
- Took 667 cases

- Made 960 traffic enforcement stops
- Issued 208 citations
- Made 276 arrests

RECRUITMENT & RETENTION

Throughout 2021, the Lemoore Police Department actively conducted recruitment efforts by holding presentations at the Tulare-Kings Counties Basic Peace Officer Academy. The Department had a total of 145 applications submitted during open recruitment for Reserve and Lateral Police Officer positions.

In 2021, the Lemoore Police Department hired 6 Reserve Police Officers. 4 Reserve Police Officers were hired and became full time Police Officers with the Department. 1 additional Crossing Guard was hired for Freedom Elementary.

The recruitment and retention team had two Police Officers assigned to the COS Police Academy as Recruit Training Officers (RTO). One RTO attends the intensive academy once a week during the week and the second RTO attends the extended academy class once a week on the weekend. The Recruit Training Officers assist academy instructors by training the cadets and providing leadership for the class. The RTO's have done a great job recruiting talented individuals and providing insight on the training provided for cadets.

The Lemoore Police Department Field Training Program provides a standardized program to facilitate the transition from an academic setting obtained in the police academy to the actual performance of general law enforcement duties.

The program's goal is to prepare new officers to perform in a patrol assignment and to posses all skills needed to operate safely and in a professional manner. A new officer will typically take 4 months to complete the program and be able to operate as a solo officer. Some of the topics that are covered during the training are the following:

- Officer Safety Procedures
- Search and Seizure
- Patrol Procedures
- Report Writing
- Investigations
- Agency Policy
- Traffic
- Community Relations



POLICE EXPLORERS PROGRAM





Lemoore Police Explorer Post #1097 is open to young men and women ages 14 (and completed the 8th grade) and not yet 21 years old with an interest in learning more about careers in the field of Law Enforcement. The program provides career orientation experiences, leadership opportunities, and community service activities. Lemoore Police Department combines classroom and practical training with Ride-Alongs in police vehicles and Community Policing. Explorers develop leadership skills, interpersonal communication skills, respect for police officers and other explorers, and learn Law Enforcement Protocols.

The Lemoore Police Explorers resumed operation in November of 2021 and have been actively recruiting new members from both the Lemoore High School to recruit during their freshman orientation as well as the public safety classes. We will also be actively recruiting at West Hills College for incoming students who are interested in a career in Law Enforcement.

In past years we have had an opportunity to participate in several activities and to assist the Lemoore Recreation Department Shamrock Shuffle, 4th of July and Veterans Day 5K runs.

This fall, through recruitment efforts, the post has maintained a roster of 10-15 Explorers and we expect to continue growing with community support.

The Lemoore Police Department's Police Activities League began in June of 2015. Department's PAL programs include Wrestling, CrossFit Kids, and an Afterschool Program. All of our PAL programs have the same mission, which is as follows; PAL is aimed at reaching out to at risk kids and providing them with direction. The program also builds relationships between police officers and the youth. Lemoore PAL has not only seen a success from the participants in the program but from the community volunteers who have logged countless hours with the program to ensure it is a successful Lemoore Police Officers one. volunteer their personal time to assist as coaches, mentors, and board members.

VOLUNTEERS IN POLICING

The department is truly fortunate to have the free services from a few dozen Volunteers in Policing. The Volunteers in Policing program was implemented in 1997. Graduates of the Citizens Academy volunteer hours to pick up and deliver mail, drive patrol cars for service or repair, make patrol checks, perform clerical work, work radar, finger printing, provide traffic control at crime scenes and support functions with special enforcement operations, and other tasks as required. Currently there are 18 Lemoore Police Department Volunteers in Policing.

Since its inception in 1997, Lemoore Police Department VIPs

In 2021, the Lemoore Police Department VIPs donated 3,616 hours of service to the Department and our community.



The Lemoore Volunteer Fire Department is comprised of 33 volunteer members, 10 of which are certified Emergency Medical Technicians, 24 hold their Firefighter I certificate, and 19 hold their Firefighter I/II certificate. We had 8 Firefighters complete the EMT program, and are awaiting testing. LVFD strives to provide the community with the best Fire Protection service possible.

In 2021, the Lemoore Volunteer Fire Department responded to a total of 2,092 incidents. The charts below show a breakdown of the incident calls for 2020.

The public service activities we participated in included 100th Anniversary Celebration of LVFD, National Night Out, Christmas Parade, Memorial Flag Raising for fallen officers, Easter Egg Hunt at Fox Station, 4th of July Parade, Pops with Cops, Battle of the Badges blood drive, Trick or Treating at the station, Presents on Patrol, and numerous drive by birthday parties. Lemoore Volunteer Fire Department Association held their 1st Annual Charity Golf Tournament in the Spring of 2021, and raised \$30,500 dollars to donate to the Leon S. Peters Burn Center in Fresno. With the increase in response to medical calls, and the COVID-19 restrictions/guidelines LVFD was able to adapt and overcome this pandemic.

SUSP will provide full water operations and management for the City of Lemoore located at 711 W. Cinnamon Dr., Lemoore, CA 93245.

- SUSP will provide CPO services with a Grade 2 Treatment Operator or higher.
- SUSP will be onsite twice a week.
- SUSP will provide a vehicle and hand tools needed for staff. SUSP will provide fuel and maintenance for the vehicle.
- SUSP operations staff will do all necessary reporting.
- SUSP operations staff will maintain all plant records and keep an onsite log of operations activity and issues.

Conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property arose within the City of Lemoore on June 21, 2021, caused by one of the water tanks located at the City's Station 7 Water Facility Complex failing, resulting in the loss of access to two storage tanks holding 1.5 million gallons of water each, and three active water wells ("Water Incident"), all of which is further described in the Director's Emergency Proclamation.

The City Manager acting as the Director proclaimed the existence of a Local Emergency within the City on June 22, 2021 and issued Emergency Orders effective immediately in accordance with the Local Emergency Proclamation.

The Resolution states that the local emergency shall be reviewed at least once every sixty (60) days, as required by law. Resolutions 2021-17, 2021-22, 2021-29, and 2022-01 were approved renewing the declaration.

Financial Consideration(s):

Full fiscal impacts are unknown at this time.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

City Council could require that each decision be made by City Council, however, that option could lead to numerous issues including, but not limited to, untimely delays in protecting the safety of the public and property, additional monetary losses, ongoing OSHA involvement, as well as infringe upon the Council – Manager form of government, whereby the City Manager is responsible for decisions on day-to-day operations.

A RESOLUTION OF THE LEMOORE CITY COUNCIL TO REVIEW AND RENEW THE DECLARATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY, AND THE RELATED DECLARATIONS AND ORDERS THEREIN.

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 and Lemoore Municipal Code section 2-4-4 empowers the Director of Emergency Services ("Director") to proclaim a Local Emergency if the City Council is not in session, and requires that the City Council shall take action to ratify the Proclamation within seven (7) days thereafter; and

WHEREAS, conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property arose within the City of Lemoore on June 21, 2021, caused by one of the water tanks located at the City's Station 7 Water Facility Complex failing, resulting in the loss of access to two storage tanks holding 1.5 million gallons of water each, and three active water wells ("Water Incident"), all of which is further described in the Director's Emergency Proclamation (Attached hereto as **Exhibit A**); and

WHEREAS, the City Manager acting as the Director proclaimed the existence of a Local Emergency within the City on the 22nd day of June, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City Council ratified and confirmed the Director's proclamation of the existence of a Local Emergency within the City on the 22nd day of June, 2021; and

WHEREAS, The City Council renewed and confirmed the Director's proclamation of the existence of a Local Emergency within the City of Lemoore per Resolution 2021-17 approved on August 17, 2021, 2021-22 approved on October 5, 2021, Resolution 2021-29 approved on November 16, 2021; Resolution 2022-01 on January 4, 2022.

WHEREAS, because of the Water Incident the City has been unable to provide full uninterrupted water service to City customers due to the decreased storage capacity at Station 7 Water Facility Complex and the method of treating the water currently required as a result of the Water Incident; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 8630 requires the City Council to review the need for continuing the Local Emergency at least once every sixty (60) days; and

WHEREAS, the City Council does hereby find that the above described conditions of disaster or of extreme peril have not abated, that because of the Water Incident the City is still unable to provide full uninterrupted water service to City customers, and that the existence of a Local Emergency continues within the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lemoore as follows:

- 1. The Proclamation of Local Emergency Due to Critical Incident Involving City Water Facilities is hereby continued.
- 2. The following declarations, orders, and restrictions remain in place:
 - a. Existing water restrictions remain in effect until rescinded.
 - b. Additional water restrictions will be issued as needed, including a daily limitation on gallons of usage per residence and business. The water restrictions may be based upon certain areas of the City. Any additional water restrictions shall take effect immediately upon issuance by the Director. The City Manager in consultation with the Public Works Director shall develop rules for implementation of any additional water restrictions.
 - c. The Director acting as the City Manager has authority to transfer funds as necessary to respond to the Local Emergency in all respects.
 - d. The Director may waive all local, State, and federal bidding and requests for proposal requirements prior to entering into contracts that the Director deems necessary to remedy the conditions relating to the Local Emergency. The Director shall make reasonably prudent business decisions under the circumstances.

The Director is hereby designated as the authorized representative for public assistance, and the Director shall receive, process, and coordinate all inquiries, filings, and requirements necessary to obtain available state and/or federal assistance to the City for coping with the Local Emergency.

WHEREAS, the City Council does hereby find that the above described conditions of disaster or of extreme peril did warrant and necessitate the Proclamation of the existence of a Local Emergency and the Issuance of Emergency Orders.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lemoore as follows:

- 1. The Proclamation of Local Emergency Due to Critical Incident Involving City Water Facilities, as issued by the Director, is hereby ratified and confirmed.
- 2. The following declarations, orders, and restrictions of the Director are hereby ratified and confirmed:
 - a. All outdoor watering is prohibited.
 - b. Additional water restrictions will be issued as needed, including a daily limitation on gallons of usage per residence and business. The water restrictions may be based upon certain areas of the City. Any additional water restrictions shall take effect immediately upon issuance by the Director. The City Manager in consultation with the Public Works Director shall develop rules for implementation of any additional water restrictions.
 - c. The Director acting as the City Manager has authority to transfer funds as necessary to respond to the Local Emergency in all respects.

The Director is hereby designated as the authorized representative for public assistance, and the Director shall receive, process, and coordinate all inquiries, filings, and requirements necessary to obtain available state and/or federal assistance to the City for coping with the Local Emergency.

3. The local emergency shall be reviewed at least once every sixty (60) days as required by law, and otherwise be deemed to continue to exist until its termination is proclaimed by the City Council of the City of Lemoore.

PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY DUE TO CRITICAL INCIDENT INVOLVING CITY WATER FACILITIES

DECLARATION ADDRESSING WATER RESTRICTIONS, FUNDING AND CONTRACT AUTHORITY, PRICE GOUGING, REQUESTS FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, DETERMINED AS NECESSARY TO SAFEGUARD LIFE AND PROPERTY

WHEREAS, Section 2-4-4 of the Lemoore Municipal Code authorizes the Director of Emergency Services for the City of Lemoore ("Director") to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a local emergency when the City of Lemoore is affected or likely to be affected by the actual or threatened existence of extreme conditions of disaster and peril to the safety of persons within the City; and

WHEREAS, the Director is authorized to make this Proclamation when the City Council is not in session, in which case the Proclamation shall be sent to the City Council for consideration within seven days; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2021, at approximately 1:30 p.m., one of the tanks at the City's Station 7 Water Facility Complex ("Tank") failed following a small explosion, causing 1.5 million gallons of water to dump and the loss of use of the Station 7; and

WHEREAS, Station 7 included an additional 1.5 million gallon storage tank and an integrated well; and

WHEREAS, the City is unable to use Station 7, which also resulted in the loss of use of Water Well sites 13 and 14 that feed off Station 7; and

WHEREAS, the loss of Station 7 and Well Sites 13 and 14 are for ease of reference hereafter referred to as the "Water Incident": and

WHEREAS, Station 7 and Well Sites 13 and 14 are essential components of the City's municipal water supply and severely impacts the City's ability to provide water service; and

WHEREAS, because of the Water Incident the City is unable to provide full uninterrupted water service to City customers, including sufficient pressure for adequate fire protection services; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to take immediate action: to curtail water usage by City customers; for the City to have maximum flexibility to repair, replace, and install essential infrastructure at Station 7 and Well Sites 13 and 14, and any interconnected facilities; and for the City to be able to contract for services on an emergency basis as needed.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE DOES HEREBY PROCLAIM:

- 1. There exists a local emergency due to the Water Incident ("Local Emergency"). This Proclamation of Local Emergency shall be effective immediately. The Local Emergency is necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the residents and businesses of the City of Lemoore. The Water Incident has created extreme conditions and peril necessary for the protection and survival of human life that require immediate action. The Water Incident will also require the support of other political subdivisions to address the extreme conditions of peril.
- 2. As set forth in Section 2-4-4 of the Lemoore Municipal Code, the Director is authorized to take the following actions:
- (a) To make and issue rules and regulations on matters reasonably related to the protection of life and property as affected by the Local Emergency.
- (b) To obtain vital supplies, equipment and such other properties found lacking and needed for the protection of life and property and to bind the City for the fair value thereof, and, if required immediately, to commandeer the same for public use.
 - (3) To require emergency services of any City officer or employee.
 - (4) To requisition necessary personnel or material of any City department or agency.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE DOES HEREBY DECLARE AND ORDER THE FOLLOWING:

Based upon the foregoing Declaration of Local Emergency, I, Nathan Olson, as Director of Emergency Services, declare and order effective immediately upon signing, the following in the City of Lemoore:

- (1) All outdoor watering is prohibited.
- (2) Additional water restrictions will be issued as needed, including a daily limitation on gallons of usage per residence and business. The water restrictions may be based upon certain areas of the City. Any additional water restrictions shall take effect immediately upon issuance by the Director. The City Manager in consultation with the Public Works Director shall develop rules for implementation of any additional water restrictions.
- (3) The Director acting as the City Manager has authority to transfer funds as necessary to respond to the Local Emergency in all respects.
- (4) The Director may waive all local, State, and federal bidding and requests for proposal requirements prior to entering contracts the Director deems necessary to remedy the conditions leading to the Local Emergency. The Director shall make reasonably prudent business decisions under the circumstances.
- (5) No retail or wholesale business shall engage in charging more than the normal average retail price for any merchandise sold during the state of local emergency, including, but not limited to, specifically water (commonly referred to as price gouging). The average retail price as used herein is defined to be that price at which similar

The Director is hereby designated as the authorized representative for public assistance, and the Director shall receive, process, and coordinate all inquiries, filings, and requirements necessary to obtain available state and/or federal assistance to the City for coping with the Local Emergency.

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF HANFORD AND CITY OF LEMOORE

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR FIRE & EMERGENCY SERVICES BETWEEN CITY OF HANFORD (Hanford) AND CITY OF LEMOORE (Lemoore)

- 1. <u>Purpose</u>. To establish an agreement for mutual provision of services in response to fire and other emergencies as described below.
- 2. <u>Background</u>. Mutual aid is the backbone for addressing fire protection during incidents that cannot be effectively managed by a single agency's resources. Each Party maintains equipment and personnel for the response and mitigation of emergency incidents occurring within areas under their respective jurisdictions. Lemoore property is in proximity to Hanford and allows for mutual response to emergencies by each party when requested.
- 3. <u>Scope</u>. The Party with the Nearest Available Fire Unit/s shall furnish Fire Protection Services within the jurisdiction of the Party requesting such service subject to the following provisions:
- a. That the specific details of providing the services under the terms as specified in this Agreement shall be determined by the respective Fire Chiefs of the Parties. It is understood that all plans which deal with Fire Protection Services shall adhere as closely as practical to the "nearest available unit" concept which forms the basis for this Agreement.
- b. The territories covered by this Agreement ("Agreement Area") are the City of Hanford and the City of Lemoore.
- c. The Responding Party shall respond with the unit/s requested, provided such unit(s) is/are available and closer to the reported incident than units of the requesting party. This Agreement is limited to fire resources assigned or otherwise located within the Agreement Area.
- d. The Responding Party is not obligated to furnish any Fire Protection Services if apparatus, equipment, personnel, or any combination thereof is not available as determined by the Fire Chief or their designated representative.
- e. Both Parties agree to release the other Party's resources at the earliest opportunity from any incident to which they respond.
- f. Both Parties agree that any and all support provided under this Agreement must be in accordance with their governing laws and regulations.

- 4. <u>Definitions</u>. Unless the particular provision or context otherwise requires, the definitions contained in this section shall govern the construction, meaning, and application of words used in this Agreement.
- a. "Nearest Available Fire Unit" shall mean the available fire apparatus of the appropriate type closest in dispatch and response time to the scene of the incident. Both parties agree to continuously strive to minimize unnecessary response delays to ensure that the integrity of the nearest available fire unit deployment strategy is achieved and maintained.
- b. "Requesting Party" shall mean any Party to this Agreement that requests support for Fire Protection services within its jurisdiction.
- c. "Responding Party" shall mean any Party to this Agreement that receives a request for Fire Protection Services within the jurisdiction of the Requesting Party.
- d. "Emergency Medical Service" shall mean basic life support service, not including paramedic service.
- e. "Emergency Response" shall mean immediate response and use of red lights and siren by responding units.
- f. "Fire Protection Services" shall mean firefighting capacity to contain, control, and extinguish fires; the mitigation of fire-related hazards; and emergency medical services.
- g. "Incident Commander" shall mean the person in overall command at the incident as defined in the National Incident Management System, California Vehicle Code Sections 2453 and 2454, or by such other agreement as provided by law.
- h. "Mutual Aid" shall mean request of resources based on the needs determined by the managers of the incident and subject to authorization by the Responding Party for each request.

5. Responsibilities.

- a. Hanford Fire Department will:
- (1) Upon request and subject to the terms of this Agreement, respond with one fire unit(s) as Mutual Aid to all emergency incidents (Medical and Fire Responses) within the City of Lemoore.
- (2) Retain the right to claim such additional reimbursement as may be authorized by applicable law; provided that, no reimbursement shall be given to pay employee salaries or other employee compensation or employment benefits.

b. Lemoore Fire Department will:

- (1) Upon request and subject to the terms of this Agreement, respond with one fire unit(s) as Mutual Aid to emergency incidents (Medical and Fire Responses) within the City of Hanford.
- (2) Retain the right to claim such additional reimbursement as may be authorized by applicable law; provided that, no reimbursement shall be given to pay employee salaries or other employee compensation or employment benefits.

c. Mutual Responsibilities:

- (1) Fire units responding to Mutual Aid requests shall utilize the radio frequencies assigned by the requester's dispatch center.
- (2) The first unit to arrive at the scene of the incident shall initiate appropriate action. The officer-in-charge of the first unit to arrive shall report to the Incident Commander (defined below) all pertinent information about the conditions encountered at the scene of the incident.
- (3) The first arriving officer on-scene will be the intial Incident Commander (IC). All apparatus at the scene of an emergency will be under the command of the IC on scene. The first arriving chief officer from either Party may assume IC authority; however, IC authority shall automatically vest in the first chief officer from the Requesting Party on-scene. Every effort will be made to operate as a single attack force rather than as separate agencies.
- (4) If an IC requires additional resources to augment the emergency response, he/she shall order them through the Requesting Party.
 - (5) The Incident Command System (ICS) shall be used on every incident.

6. Other Provisions.

- a. <u>Mutual Training</u>. Conduct mutual training to assure employees are familiar with protocols and equipment utilized by the other Party.
- b. <u>Common Radio Communications</u>. Work cooperatively to develop and maintain common radio communication protocols to assure adequate communication exists, while jointly responding to emergency incidents. In addition, work cooperatively and actively to deploy dispatching methods and Automatic Vehicle Location (AVL) tracking capabilities, if possible, to improve response times, reduce unnecessary delays, and provide for accountability.
- c. <u>Notifications</u>. When advised of an emergency incident within the other's jurisdiction, to make immediate notification of the incident to the jurisdictional agency.
- d. <u>Protective Equipment, Tools and Equipment</u>. Ensure that all personnel respond in and use properly maintained and serviced Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), firefighting rescue tools and equipment, specified by the sending Party's policies and consistent with State Mandates.

- e. <u>Training Mandates.</u> All personnel of either Party responding in the other Party's jurisdiction will be trained and qualified consistent with State Training and Safety Mandates, including, but not limited to, those formulated by the California Division of Occupational Safety and Health, as well as other training including, but not limited to, Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications, Hazardous Materials First Responder Operations, First Responder Medical, CPR, and Confined Space Rescue Awareness. All personnel of either Party responding in the other Party's jurisdiction shall be trained and qualified consistent with any applicable Training and Safety Mandates. Personnel responding in the other Party's jurisdiction for technical rescue, *e.g.*, personnel responding to vehicle accident with confined space victim, will meet or exceed State Mandated requirements for training and qualification for such rescues.
- f. Nothing in this MAA may be construed to obligate the City of Hanford or the Hanford Fire Department to any current or future expenditure of money in advance of the approval of the City of Hanford City Council or its authorized designee.
- g. Nothing in this MAA may be construed to obligate the City of Lemoore or the Lemoore Fire Department to any current or future expenditure of money in advance of the approval of the City of Lemoore or its authorized designee.
- h. It is the intent of the Parties hereto, and part of the consideration supporting this Agreement, that each Party shall bear all risks and obligations for its own personnel, as well as injury or damage to third parties, that may arise while responding to the requesting Party's incident in the same manner and to the same extent as if occurring within responding Party's jurisdiction.
- i. Each Party to this Agreement shall provide Workers' Compensation coverage as required by law, as applicable, for its own employees, without cost to the other Party. Neither Party shall be required to pay for salaries, other compensation or employment benefits for the employees of the other Party as a result of any work or services performed pursuant to this Agreement. The Parties agree that performance of work or services under this Agreement shall no in way create an employment or independent contractor relationship between the Parties or with one another's employees or representatives.
- j. Any request for assistance outside of the established Agreement Area will be considered a Mutual Aid request subject to authorization by the Responding Party. Response to any such request will be based on availability of requested personnel, equipment, and/or apparatus rather than the Nearest Available Fire Unit.
- 7. <u>Changes</u>. Changes/amendments may be made to this agreement by mutual written consent of both parties, and will be recorded and published as addenda to this agreement.
- 8. <u>Termination/Expiration</u>. This agreement may be terminated by mutual consent of both parties. Either party may terminate this agreement upon 60 *days prior written notification to the other party*. This agreement will remain in effect for *ten* (10) years after the effective date and will be reviewed triennally.

Subject/Discussion:

The City went to bid for the Bush Street Sewer repair and awarded the lowest and most responsible bid to JT2 INC. dba Todd Companies in the amount of \$46,750. JT2 is requesting change order 003 for \$12,730.

Change order 003 is for standby time as a result of AT&T utilities remaining unmarked. After notifying "811" of a need for utility marking, AT&T failed to mark their utility lines. The error resulted in standby time for the contractor while they sought to determine the location of the lines. The change order has a total cost of \$12,730 and the City will be seeking reimbursement from AT&T for the additional cost.

Total project budget was \$90,000 for engineering cost, testing and construction. This project will come in approximately \$16,000 under budget after approval of Change Order 003.
